RESOLUTION: With a view to bring uniformity in Homoeopathic Medical Education in the Country, the Central Council of Homoeopathy constituted under section 3 of the Homoeopathy Central Council Act, 1973 has prescribed under section 23 of the said Act, the Minimum Standards of Education in Homoeopathy. The Central Council of Homoeopathy has made Regulations with the previous sanction of Government of India, under section 33 of the said Act, for the Diploma, Graded Degree and Direct Degree Courses.

2. The Central Council of Homoeopathy has advised all the State Governments, the State Boards/Councils, Universities and the educational institutions, to take immediate steps to switch-over to these regulations from the academic session starting from 1983-84, to bring uniformity in Homoeopathic Medical Education in the country.

3. The Court of Examiners of Homoeopathic and Biochemic System of Medicine, Bombay, has approached Government expressing desire to introduce the Diploma Course (i.e. the Homoeopathic (Diploma Course) regulations, 1983, in all the 24 Homoeopathic Medical Colleges in the Maharashtra State and also to discontinue the present L.C.E.H. and D.H.M.S. Diploma Courses from 1st June, 1983.

4. The Government of Maharashtra is pleased to accept the recommendation of the Court of Examiners of Homoeopathic and Bio-chemic Systems of Medicine and to convey the sanction to introduce the Diploma Course of the Central Council of Homoeopathy in all the Homoeopathic Medical Colleges (except St. Chundabai Mohanlal Patel Homoeopathic Medical College, Vile Parle, 2003).

5. Government is further pleased to direct that the existing Diploma course L.C.E.H. and D.H.M.S. should be discontinued with effect from the academic year 1983-84. The Homoeopathic and Biochemic Medical Colleges in Maharashtra (except St. Chundabai

Mr. Harshad Patel Homoeopathy Medical College, Vile Parle, Bombay) should not give admissions to the L.C.E.M. and B.H.M.S. Diploma Courses, with effect from the academic session of 1953-54.
